

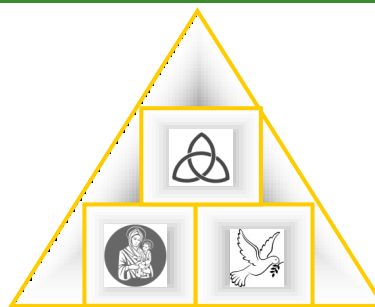

From Father McCabe

Summer time is a time to relax and enjoy long evening meals with family and friends. At one such meal the conversation turned to how one's faith can become strengthened the quickest. Upon reflection, we agreed that the Lord deepened our faith the quickest during times of testing – some cross was given and endured, even at times gratefully accepted.

We read in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC), paragraph #1816: "The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: 'All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks.' Service of and witness to the faith are necessary for salvation: 'So every one who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.'"

I can't remember where, but I am almost certain that St. Augustine wrote that we do not have to like all the crosses that God gives us, but that we need to endure each one of them out of love for God and others. This makes sense because in school, or in any sport, or any relationship or job, you might love many dimensions, but there are normally one or a few things with which you struggle and these things call you to die to self and endure them for the good of all.

These crosses help every student of life, every student of Christian discipleship, become a well-rounded person who appreciates the gifts and strengths of others, and how we all must put forth effort and die to ourselves in order to attain a deeper community, a better understanding of the common good.

Today's second reading from Hebrews addresses the importance of following Christ in his passion in order to gain "the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it."

St. Paul writes to some of the early Christians, and to some of us: "You have also forgotten the exhortation addressed to you as sons: 'My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him; for who the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges.'

"Endure your trials as 'discipline'; God treats you as sons. For what 'son' is there whom his father does not discipline? At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are

trained in it." Hebrews, 12:5-7, 11-13.

Before his death in 386 A. D., St. Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, wrote a catechetical instruction to help those who entered the Catholic Church through baptism: "The Catholic Church is the distinctive name of this holy Church which is the mother of us all. She is the bride of our Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God (for Scripture says: *Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her*). She is the type and she bears the image of *the Jerusalem above that is free and is the mother of us all*, that Jerusalem which once was barren but now has many children...

"Instructed in this holy Catholic Church and bearing ourselves honorably, we shall gain the kingdom of heaven and inherit eternal life. For the sake of enjoying this at the Lord's hands, we endure all things. The goal set before us is no trifling one; we are striving for eternal life...

"Now real and true life is none other than the Father, who is the fountain of life and who pours forth his heavenly gifts on all creatures through the Son in the Holy Spirit, and the good things of eternal life are faithfully promised to us men also, because of his love for us."

It is so good to know that God the Father loves us, through Jesus Christ and his Catholic Church, even while we are enduring – and perhaps even embracing – the crosses that conform us to Jesus Christ who won for us perfect happiness in heaven.
