We Belong to the Communion of Saints

To be baptized into Jesus Christ is to share in the love, power and goodness of God and the community of his saints by loving God above all things and loving God appropriately within all things. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the greatest of all saints because she never sinned and was designated by God to be the Mother of his Divine Son, Jesus Christ. During this Season of Lent, we are called to increase our prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and we turn to the saints to help us grow in these acts of charity. It is inspiring to see many people coming to Mass 25 minutes early to pray the Rosary which is a fruitful way to praise God, receive his natural and supernatural blessings, and to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of All Saints.

During this month of March, the Church celebrates St. Patrick, whose feast day is Friday, March 17. Join us for Stations of the Cross, 8:00PM, at St. Mary's Church. And St. Joseph, whose Solemn Feast Day is March 19, but because that date falls on a Sunday this year, the Solemnity has been transferred to Monday, March 20. We will celebrate two Solemn Masses on that day, 8:00AM (normal Mass time) and 8:30PM.
