

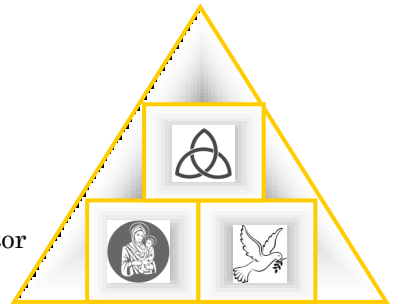

From Father McCabe



Jesus gives us a map to the highest heights of heaven with his Sermon on the Mount, (Mt., Chapters 5-7), beginning with the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes deepen the Ten Commandments, of which Jesus perfectly fulfilled.

Jesus and Mary are the perfect examples of obeying God in line with their holy desires. Jesus did everything that God the Father asked of him. He perfected the Law and the Prophets, and Mary did as well. By following your wholesome desires, you will grow in holiness. But here is the problem: sometimes our desires are not always wholesome. The desire for friendship is wholesome, but how and why we make friends can be less than wholesome, less than virtuous.

Sometimes we just want to belong, or be affirmed, and will do things without thinking about the consequences. Unfortunately, many people, especially young people whose ability to judge prudently is not fully developed, can fall into the trap of being extorted. Extortion occurs when another person has some information about your mistakes, sins or weaknesses that they use to control you.

Extortion is happening on the internet at an alarming rate, especially among young people. Your children like to make friends, and sometimes they might be tempted to make anonymous friends on the internet. That person may try to get to know your child by asking them about their hopes, and affirm them. But then they may ask about their greatest fears or most embarrassing moments.

If your son or daughter gives that information to that anonymous person, they may threaten to use this information to manipulate them. They may ask for very private information or photos of you. Even family photos can be used to scare children into thinking that this anonymous person has power to harm their family.

Parents, it so important for you to teach your children to be vigilant, to know how to make good friends in Christ so that they can have a fulfilling childhood and happy life as a Christian adult.

We must remind our children that if they made a mistake, or that someone on the internet is asking them personal questions, even posing as a friend or relative, let me repeat, even posing as a friend or relative, they should stop the conversation immediately and talk to you about it.

Aunts and uncles, grandparents, godparents, we need to form a vigilant community to help all children live fulfilled lives by reminding them never to give out information over the internet.

Even when the format they are using says that it is private, or their anonymous gaming friend says that they can be trusted, do not give out any information that can be manipulated and made public.

You can imagine how much fun it is to game with people throughout the world and gain points to get to the next level. One dimension of the game is that your character can choose various actions. Soon your online character is asked to do immoral activities to gain points. What then?

It is possible for your character to be tagged to you, and then your anonymous gaming friend says, "Hey, I am going to send that evil choice of your character to your parents, unless you do this or that. I know that they would be angry that you are even playing this game." What then? Stop, and

have the courage to talk it through with your parents who will appreciate that you are asking them to prevent danger from coming to the family.

Even if your child has made some mistakes, there are ways to protect your child and your family. But that depends upon one thing, if your child has the love, trust and courage to tell you what has happened.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' theme is that we must be vigilant in following God's ways of holiness to be fulfilled. Parents, we want our children to live fulfilling lives but it is impossible to abolish all the good things in the world that can be abused to harm our children. The internet can be an instrument for good, but it can be used in a perverse way to cause much spiritual harm to anyone, especially your children.

The only way we can strengthen our children and one another is to follow the example of Jesus and Mary who perfectly fulfilled God's wholesome desires. We must be vigilant and fight against evil temptations that come our way. We must avoid the near occasions of sin.

Lent is an opportunity to grow in holiness so that we can protect our children and one another. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18, it is a liturgical season in which we strive to grow in holiness by deepening our daily prayers, abstaining and fasting from good things to strengthen our will power, and by giving alms to the poor.

However, we all know that sometimes we are vulnerable and fall into sin. The good news is that Jesus Christ and Holy Mother Church are here to help forgive those sins and help us to resolve the difficult situations when we fall. There is a way out, God always loves us and wants to help us resolve our problems. Jesus and his Church are here to protect all children from the criminality and impurity of the world which is only a couple of clicks away on the internet. Entering Lent as a family will help you and your children grow as vigilant and holy followers of Jesus Christ, and thus find everlasting fulfillment in Jesus Christ, the divine leader of his Catholic Church.
