

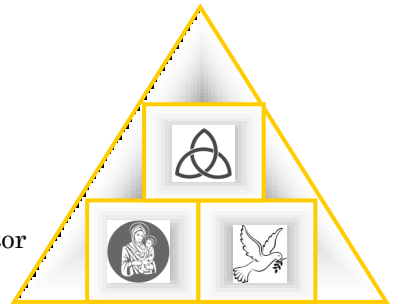

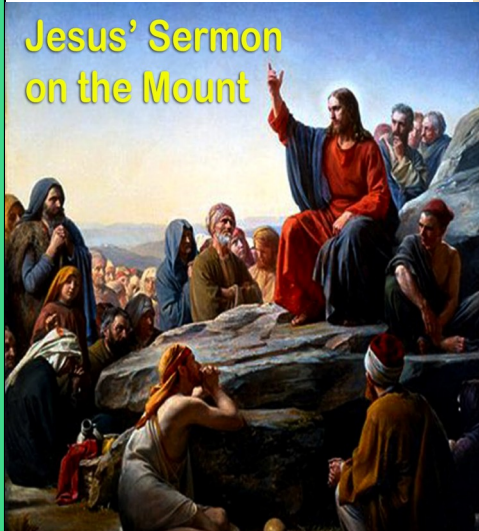

We'll make sure you receive your caucus location and other important information. **Thank you!** How do we build family spiritual life? We need to grow in faith by praying, worshipping together, studying and having fun discussing, and maybe even quizzing our children and one another about our Catholic Christian faith.

First, Jesus Christ is THE FOUNDATION of our spiritual life since we have been baptized into his very life, death and resurrection, and his love for God and others was perfect.

As we read in last Sunday's Gospel, "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen." From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Mt. 4:16-17)

Jesus is the foundation and the light to building our individual, family and parish spiritual life. He gives us a blueprint with his **Sermon on the Mount**, (Mt., Chapters 5 -7), beginning with the **Beatitudes**. *The Beatitudes deepen the Ten Commandments, of which Jesus perfectly fulfilled. Just as a beautiful house must have solid exterior walls for protection (The Ten Commandments), so too it should have a beautiful interior (The Beatitudes) which deepen and enrich a person's heart and soul.*

If you have memorized the Ten Commandments in their correct order, then you have the framework to memorizing the Beatitudes. If not, here is help:

Think: "God comes first," since he loves you and all of us into creation and sustains our every heart beat and breath. Thus, the first three Commandments pertain to God: I. I am the Lord, Your God, you shall have no other gods before me. II. You shall not take God's name in vain. III. Remember to keep holy the Sabbath.

The first three Beatitudes correspond and deepen these Commandments. The first beatitude: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." If you are poor, you want to find work. If you are poor in spirit, you put **GOD FIRST** by working to know, love and serve him. Your morning "Our Father...", and other prayers, will help put **GOD FIRST**, and the gods of greed, comfort and untethered curiosity will be pushed away, for God wants us to have a dynamic relationship with him and one another.

The second Beatitude: "**Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.**" deepens the Second Commandment: "You shall not take God's Name in vain." We bear the Christian name, but sometimes in vain because we sin and thus do not live up to our calling. Sin and its effects are what we mourn. But the "Good News" is that as Christians we know that Christ forgives the sins we mourn and repent of, especially in the Sacrament of Confession which gives us comfort.

"**Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.**" This corresponds well with the 3rd Commandment since to "**Remember to keep holy the Sabbath**" means to gather as a "member" of God's people weekly to build up the Kingdom. Our beautiful Church, and all the ministries we do, are not built up by one person, but by many committed parishioners who are meek because we know that we need God and his community of Christ – the Church – in order to enter the promised land of heaven.

The next set of Commandments deal with FAMILY LIFE, as do the corresponding Beatitudes:

IV. Honor thy Father and Mother > "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied." Thanks Mom and Dad for cleansing and feeding me as a child, and thank you God the Father and Holy Mother Church for bringing us Jesus Christ, who sanctifies us (as mentioned in the second reading today), and gives us himself in the Bread of Eternal Life for those who are spiritually prepared.

V. You shall not kill. > "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy." Everyone has a Mom and a Dad from which they have received the gift of life from God. But we know that our parents were affected by Original Sin, just as we are, and so we know that all of us are in need of God's mercy. Thus, we all need to grow in holiness and virtue. Those who do not promote the Ten Commandments, nor the Beatitudes are jeopardizing their place in heaven.

For this is what Jesus said, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill... Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments (Jesus refers to the Beatitudes here) and teaches others to do so will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven. I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven." (Mt. 5:17)

This Bible passage of Jesus preaching helps us to realize the essential importance of striving to have the highest place in heaven by living the Beatitudes deeply with him and his Church, unlike some Pharisees and scribes who rejected the Ten Commandments, and Christ, who was fulfilling them perfectly.

Unfortunately, I am running out of space, but I hope you continue to build up your FAMILY'S SPIRITUAL LIFE by meditating, discussing and quizzing each other on God's Ten Commandments of life and love, and Jesus' Beatitudes that glorify God and so build up your place in heaven. My Sunday Bulletin Article for next week will continue this line of thinking and cover the rest of the Beatitudes.
