From Father McCabe

Not many people remember how Moses held up his hands in prayer while Joshua fought the enemies of God. Those who do remember today's first reading from the book of Exodus, can imagine Moses holding up his hands to God in prayer. As long as he did that the blessing of God's strength descended upon the Jewish soldiers, and they began winning the battle for survival.

When Moses rested and lowered his hands the enemies of God began winning the battle. Thus, Aaron and Hur got a rock for Moses to sit on, and they stood on each side of Moses to hold up his hands and they too prayed with him until the battle was decisively won by God and his people working together. Moses is the central figure of the Old Testament since he led the Jewish people out of slavery to the promised land, a land flowing with milk and honey. However, to get to the promised land and settle it, Moses had to teach the people about God and how essential it is to pray throughout the day in order to overcome evil and draw down God's blessings.

In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, we read this: "Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposes effort. The great figures of prayer of the Old Covenant [the Old Testament], before Christ, as well as [Mary] the Mother of God, the saints, and [Christ] himself, all teach us this: prayer is a battle.

Against whom? Against ourselves [our lazy, broken selves] and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn [us] away from prayer, away from union with God. We pray as we live, because we live as we pray. If we do not want to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ, neither can we pray habitually in his Name. The "spiritual battle" of the Christian's new life [in baptism and confirmation] is inseparable from the battle of prayer." See *CCC* paragraph #2725


In today's Gospel Jesus Christ reminds us that we must persevere in prayer. We must pray in Jesus' Name, and it is indeed helpful to have one or two people help you to pray, just as Moses had Aaron and Hur there to help him pray. Remember the words of Jesus, "Where two or three are gathered in my Name, there am I in their midst."

God always answers your prayers. Sometimes God's answer is "Yes, because this will deepen our relationship and save souls." Sometimes God answers, "No, I have something better for you, but keep praying and you will understand." This answer tests our patience and perseverance. Many people stop pray-

ing at this point, but God is constantly calling us to open our mind and heart to his truth and mercy.

Sometimes God answers, "Not yet, because you are not mature enough to handle what I am going to ask of you."



And what could that essential part be? If we pray only to get things from God, even excellent things from God, but do not realize that it is our deepening relationship with God to fulfill our mission, then we often are reluctant to pray, or we pray half heartily since we are missing sight of one's vocation.

The Lord Jesus shows us in today's Gospel to pray always and to never tire of praying because talking with God, listening to God, or praising him for all the good and mercy in your life, really is a sign of a true relationship with God that is deepening and bearing much fruit.

When we pray and read the Bible, we begin to realize that God is speaking to us through love letters. When we write down in a prayer journal our inspirations and insights, and then bring your journal to Mass, or spiritual talks, and write in them what you are learning, you are essentially writing back to God.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes that prayer can be a battle, but when we pray with others, including our patron Saints and the Blessed Virgin Mary, we allow the Holy Spirit to rush in and lead us in prayer that can bring an amazing experience of the power of God's love and wisdom.

Imagine driving on the highway in a car full of people. If one person opens their window a little, there is not much effect. But if everyone were to open their windows fully, you would have such a rush of wind and freshness that it might take your breath away for a little bit, especially when the junk in your car starts flying out the window.

People of God, let us open the windows of our hearts and remember to pray in Jesus' Name, every day individually and with your family, when possible, especially at every weekend Mass. Then the Holy Spirit will win the battle against evil and bring you to the promised land of heaven.
