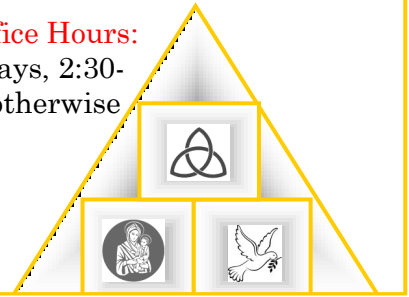

From Father McCabe



What a prayerful, solemn and joyful last week we had. It started with the 6th Sunday of Easter and Mother's Day when we thanked God and our mothers for life. Archbishop Hebda had an appointment cancel on Sunday so he texted me just before Mass on Saturday and asked if he could celebrate any of the Masses on Sunday. I know it's a long drive for him so I invited him to preside at the 10:30AM Mass at St. Columbkil. He had beautiful words of encouragement as he was impressed with the prolife sign we have and the community room expansion for our handicap ramp.

On Wednesday night, May 13, we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima who appeared May 13, 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. Mary called Catholics throughout the world to pray the Rosary for the end to war (World War 1 was raging at that time) and for God's peace, love and truth to win the day, otherwise there would be a greater war (World War 2) and communist Russia would spread its lies throughout the world. Unfortunately, not enough Catholics heeded her call and we see how communism has ravaged our world. In both wars the United States of America's military and, dare I say prayerfulness and sacrifices, played an important role in bringing an end to both WWI and WWII. Still, we are called to pray the Rosary daily so that we can put an end to the war against the unborn child trusting that through our prayers and sacrifices we will see the promise of the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

On Thursday night we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of St. Paul with Bishop Michael Izen who spoke about growing in our discipleship through daily prayer and employing the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These divine gifts are: Wisdom – for a deepening faith; Knowledge – for a deepening hope; Piety – for a deepening love of God and others; Counsel – for a deepening virtue of prudence; Courage – for a deepening virtue of fortitude; Understanding – for a deepening virtue of justice (right relationship with God and others); and Fear of the Lord – for a deepening virtue of temperance, so that we do not lose our temper but rather modify our appetites and emotions.

Let us pray for openness to these seven sacred gifts of the Holy Spirit and pray for our students who were sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit by the reception of Confirmation: Brenna Buck (Kateri), Ben Gadiant (Michael the Archangel), Corbin Jaeger (John the Apostle), Brooke Lodermeier (Joan of Arc), Jackson Lodermeier (Sebastian), Nathan Mirsberger (Hubert), Ellie Nardinger (Marie of the Incarnation), Oleana O'Reilly (Casilda), William Peterson (John the Evangelist), Duncan Poncelet (Anthony of Padua), Grayson Ryan (Paul), Ben Scheffler (Raymond Pentafort),

The following is a reflection of Pentecost from an ancient author of the 6th century. "The disciples spoke in the language of every nation. At Pentecost God chose this means to indicate the presence of the Holy Spirit: whoever had received the Spirit spoke in every kind of tongue. We must realize, dear brothers (and sisters), that this same Holy Spirit by whom love is poured out in our hearts. It was love that was to bring the Church of God together all over the world. And as individual men who received the Holy Spirit in those days could speak in all kinds of tongues, so today the Church, united by the Holy Spirit, speaks in the language of every people.

"Therefore if somebody should say to one of us, "You have received the Holy Spirit, why do you not speak in the tongues of all men?" But because I belong to the body of Christ, that is the Church, she does speak all languages.

"This was the way in which the Lord's promise was fulfilled: *No one put new wine into old wineskins. New wine is put into fresh skins, and so both are preserved.* So when the disciples were heard speaking in all kinds of languages, some people were not far wrong in saying: *They have been drinking too much new wine.* The truth is that the disciples had now become fresh wineskins, renewed and made holy by grace. The fervor brimmed over and they spoke in manifold tongues. By the spectacular miracle they became a sign of the Catholic Church, which embraces the language of every nation.

"Keep this feast, then, as members of the one body of Christ. It will be no empty festival for you, if you really live what you are celebrating. For you are the members of that Church which the Lord acknowledges as his own, being himself acknowledged by her, that same Church which he fills with the Holy Spirit as she spreads through the world. He is like a bridegroom who never loses sight of his own bride; no one could ever deceive him by substituting some other woman.

"To you men of all nations, then, who make up the Church of Christ, you, the bride of Christ – to all of you the Apostles addresses these words: *Bear with one another in love; do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.* Notice that when Paul urges us to bear with one another, he bases his argument on love, and when he speaks of our hope of unity, he emphasizes the bond of peace. This Church is the house of God, built up of living stones, whose master is almighty God. It is his delight to dwell here. Take care, then, that he never has the sorrow of seeing it undermined by schism and collapsing in ruins."

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes the effects of Confirmation in paragraph 1303:...*Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:*

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation [being a child of God in Jesus] which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!";
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross:

"Recall then that you have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence, the spirit of holy fear in God's presence. Guard what you have received. God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts." St. Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, Italy, (c.340-397 A.D.)

May Crowning celebrated at all Masses May 9 & 10:

The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three young shepherds beginning on May 13, 1917, near Fatima, Portugal, and asked that all Catholics pray the Rosary daily for the end of war and the conversion of hardened sinners, that peace would reign in our world. In the Glorious Mysteries, the last mystery is the Crowning of Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth. This mystery reflects the truth found in the Book of Revelation: Chapter 12:1,5: *“A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars... She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne.. The serpent, however, spewed a torrent of water out of his mouth after the woman to sweep her away with the current. But the earth helped the woman and opened its mouth and swallowed the flood that the dragon spewed out of its mouth. Then the dragon became angry with the woman and went off to wage war against the rest of her offspring, those who keep God’s commandments and bear witness to Jesus.”* But do not fear, we follow Christ to victory!
