From Father McCabe

Have you ever had your expectations fall short in front of your eyes?

I was watching America's Funniest Videos with some parishioners. These videos were capturing children as they received their Christmas gifts.

In one video, a boy of about five years of age received a t-shirt that read, something like, "Wear this to Disney World this Winter". His parents read it for him, and he looked at them with wonderment in his eyes. The parents read the shirt to him again and he asked, "Are we going to Disney Land?" And they said, "We are going to Disney World. We are going to fly on an airplane to Disney World."

At that point, the boy looked at his other gifts, picked up a bag of Goldfish crackers and said, "I really like these Goldfish treats!" I wish I could have seen the look on the faces of his parents. I do not think his response to the gift is what they expected.

In today's Gospel we see that St. John the Baptist (the greatest man born of woman up to the time of Jesus Mt. 11:11) was unsure about Jesus' messianic mission and what to expect.

St. John asked, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" (*Mt 11:2*) He is probably wondering, "If Jesus is the Messiah, then why am I in prison? Why has Jesus not set me free and placed me in his Kingdom as to be expected?"

In last Sunday's Gospel we heard how John the Baptist called everyone to confess their sins and show that they had truly repented by doing good works for the glory of God. He called everyone to prepare for the Messiah who was greater than he, and that the Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire.

But now his expectations are being tested, for he is languishing in prison. He sends two of his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?"

Jesus reminds John the Baptist and all of us that he truly is the Messiah since he is curing the blind, healing the lame, raising the dead and having the good news proclaimed to the poor.

Jesus also reminds us that, as great as John is, the "least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he (*Mt 11:11*)."

What this means is that those who are "least in the kingdom of heaven are greater" than John the Baptist because they cannot sin in heaven. Since they have passed through the fire of purification, they are now perfect in every way.

When Jesus refers to the "least in the kingdom of heaven" that means that there are some saints who are "greater" in the kingdom of heaven. These are the prophets like Moses and Elijah and others who gave their lives for the truth of God's holiness. In our day, we can compare these to Saints like St. Thomas Aquinas, St. John Henry Newman and St. Mother Theresa, who worked among the poorest of the poor.

Of course, the greatest of all Saints is the blessed Virgin Mary who God made to be, as the angel Gabriel addressed her, "full of grace" (Lk 1:28, the Greek word for this phrase is kecharitomene: kay-caree-toe-may-nay). If God calls you

"full of grace" then there is no room in your soul for any sin, even venial sin. For this beautiful Greek word applied only to Mary means that she was full of grace from the beginning, is full of grace at the Annunciation, and will always be full of grace.



When St. Mary was conceived, God protected her from the stain of Original Sin, and that is what we call the Immaculate Conception. God gave this singular gift to Mary so that she could bear God's divine Son in the pure chamber of her heart, mind, soul and womb. She had perfect faith, hope and love that kept on growing.

God made our first parents, Adam and Eve, without the stain of Original Sin too, but they eventually sinned against God by not helping one another follow God's way of holiness. They stopped growing spiritually.

In the case of the Blessed Virgin Mary, she always said "Yes" to the Holy Spirit, and "No" to sin. The Blessed Virgin Mary and her divine Son, Jesus Christ, always helped each other accomplish God's plan out of perfect love for God and his disciples. It was not always easy, for the Blessed Virgin Mary suffered with her Son at his crucifixion, which completed her perfect surrender to the fiery love of God.

Now we know that the Blessed Virgin Mary is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven, in which Jesus Christ is the God King.

We also know that John the Baptist was a martyr for Jesus, despite his being wrong in what he expected the Kingdom of Jesus would look like here on earth.

Have you ever had your expectations fall short in front of your eyes, like St. John the Baptist? Yet, in hindsight you get a glimpse of God's plan for you which was beyond anything you could have imagined?

I believe we get a glimpse of that at every Holy Mass. For unlike John the Baptist, we have received the opportunity to confess our sins and further receive Jesus Christ in Holy Communion, the closest we can get to God on earth!

John is the greatest prophet, yes, because he did not have the sacraments to strengthen him, rather only God's mission written on his heart. Yet, he died for Jesus Christ and Christ died for him and us, and we get to celebrate that at every Mass and thereby grow in God's divine life while we persevere in his Kingdom.

Thus, on this earthly journey, we are drawn more intimately to the Heart of Jesus than St. John the Baptist could during his earthly life, as we are united to Christ and his Church through our baptism and our participation in the other sacraments.


