#### From Father McCabe

When I was serving in our Archdiocese mission parish in Venezuela, I encountered many difficult situations. The only resolution to those difficult situations was to stir up the gift of faith in God's truth and love through prayer. Prayer does two things: it serves God's glory by entrusting ourselves to his power, and it increases our faith in God.

Night comes quickly in Venezuela because it is near the equator. By 6:30 p.m. in June it is completely dark. During that month I was driving on a narrow street in one of the twelve neighborhoods that we serve. I encountered a blockade of tree branches and old tires strewn across the road as a sign of protest against the government.

I tried to turn the truck around but instead slide into a deep ditch and was stuck. The men in the community tried to free me, but they were unsuccessful. Another missionary came with his truck and some rope, but after many failed attempts we decided to call a tow truck.

As we waited for the tow truck, one of the Youth Group members mentioned that we had not prayed to God for help. She was right, we had to change our approach. Therefore, about five of us gathered in a circle and prayed that the truck would be freed. After that prayer I said to the men, "Let's give it one more try."

Finally, with one more push and uncanny ease the truck was free and on the road. Youth Group members thanked God, laughed and clapped their hands.

Our heavenly Father is so good at serving those who pray together for the same resolution that glorifies his Name. We learned that we cannot overcome difficulties on our own power, but only by serving God through prayer and enjoying God's glory in the way he serves us.

In today's Gospel the Apostles want to have their faith increased. Jesus told <u>them</u> that if <u>they</u> had the faith the size of a mustard seed that <u>they</u> could do amazing things.

Here's the key, they need to pray <u>together</u> in the Holy Spirit to glorify God and to be served by his resolution! Jesus said, "If <u>you</u> would say to this mulberry tree, be uprooted and planted in the sea," it would obey <u>you</u>." Unfortunately, it is not that obvious in the English translation because <u>"You"</u> can be singular or plural, but in the Spanish translation it is clear that Jesus is saying "<u>You</u>" in the plural, to all the Apostles who want their faith to increase together.

Since we share in Jesus' ministry with today's apostles, our Pope and Bishops, we as a community in Jesus Christ can pray in the power and love of the Holy Spirit for some marvelous things to happen.

We need to believe Jesus when he said, "Where two or three are gathered in my Name, there am I in the midst of them." When we prayed together in Venezuela, I am convinced that Jesus heard our prayers and sent an angel to help us move that truck out of the ditch and onto the street.

Around your supper table at home, how do you want to glorify or serve God and how do you wish him to serve you? What do you pray for together in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit? Is it for more faith, more hope, more love and understanding? Maybe it is for more time for prayer and family activities that glorify God?

At this altar of sacrifice, this table of God's family of faith, let us glorify God by asking Jesus to increase our faith that we might trust in his love, truth and mercy. Let us ask that we,

and our family and friends, have a <u>deepening</u> <u>conversion</u> to Jesus' real presence in the Holy Eucharist.

Conversion, of course, means change, and that is one of the most difficult things for people to do. But if we want our faith to increase, we must be open to positive change by addressing the diffi-

cult situations in our life by obliging God to help us through prayer, and trusting in the service that he gives us.

Change and conversion can be difficult and ongoing, but some Jews were able to embrace the Christian faith - that the one, true God is three divine persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and thus we are baptized into Jesus Christ in God's Name to follow him to heaven. Jesus asked for this, even though he probably spoke in Aramaic, and yet the Lord inspired the four Gospels to be written in Greek to reach a wider audience.

Then, Pope Victor I changed the liturgical language from Greek to Latin around the year 190 AD, to help the common man pray and evangelize - the mission of the Church. However, the Church did keep the Hebrew words "Alleluia - Praise the Lord", and "Amen - It is true," as well as the Greek phrase, "Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison - Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy." Although we now pray in modern English, we can pray "Agnus Dei" and other Latin prayers since Latin is the official language of the Roman Catholic Church.

Since the Vatican II Council (Oct. 1, 1962 - Dec. 8, 1965) the pope and bishops, as successors of St. Peter and the apostles, were called to adapt the language of the Sacred Liturgy to the common tongue of the cultures within which the Church exists. To that end the Catholic Church reviews and promulgates the official sacred texts such as the *Roman Missal, Lectionary* and the *Liturgy of the Hours*. For the English speaking world, in the *Liturgy of the Hours* the Ave Maria (Hail Mary) is in modern English: "Hail, Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women and blessed is your womb, Jesus..." No more Old English of "thee", "thou" and "thy" for we need to reach a wider audience.

Also, some children say "blessed is the fruit of <u>my womb</u>" instead of "<u>thy womb</u>" and you can hardly blame them, because they rarely hear that Old English language "thy" and "thou". There are more children, especially among our Spanish brothers and sisters in our Faith Formation program, who do not know these Old English words and may not be praying the "Hail Mary" at home in English.

In the official *Lectionary* used for the Holy Mass we read about the angel Gabriel speaking to Mary about being the Mother of God: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with <u>you</u>." As well as Elizabeth's greeting, "Blessed are <u>you</u> among women, and blessed is the fruit of <u>your</u> womb." Thus, in good conscience and in obedience to the official texts of Holy Mother Church let us do our best to follow the official texts of the Church as a model to reach a wider audience and have a better understanding of the Word made flesh for the salvation of all. Difficult, yes, but more blessings will flow because more in sync with the Church. Sincerely in Christ, Fr. Thomas McCabe
