From Father McCabe

In today's Gospel, all ten lepers obeyed Jesus and went to the Temple in Jerusalem to show themselves to the Old Testament priests. Since they were cured of leprosy the priests would allow them to enter the Holy Place of the Temple again to worship with the community. That was good, but most forgot who had cured them.

The only one to return and fall at the feet of Jesus to worship him and thank him was a foreigner. The others did not realize that Jesus was the Holy One of God and that wherever Jesus stood, that was holy ground. Jesus not only cured his body, but saved this man's soul by telling him, "Stand up and go: your faith has saved you."

He, like many of us, had the sense that saying "Thank you" to God was not enough. And so he returned to Jesus Christ to thank him and worship him, which means to give your life and all you have to Jesus Christ, and strive to pass on the gift of faith and healing love to others. We want all people to be saved and their souls to be blessed, and their hearts to be filled with "Thanksgiving" to God. And that "Thanksgiving" to God is made perfect through Jesus Christ, for he is the perfect "Thanksgiving" or "Eucharist" to God the Father.

The word "Eucharist" is from the Greek language meaning "Thanksgiving". Only the perfect love and obedience of Jesus to God the Father makes Christ that perfect thanksgiving sufficient to save all of us who faithfully follow him by uniting our thanksgivings to him at Mass.

Every Sunday Mass we come back to church, this holy ground to celebrate and unite ourselves to Jesus Christ - his life, death and resurrection to the Father. By doing this in the state of grace (after showing our souls to the priest in the confessional if needed) we thank God perfectly through, with and in Christ for the blessings of the past week and open ourselves to more of God's blessings.

Let us spread the good news that our faith in Jesus Christ, the perfect thanksgiving, has assuredly saved our life and given us Eternal Life of grace, since we obey him and worship him in the Holy Eucharist.


Speaking of salvation of body and spirit, I share a part of Archbishop Hebda's letter to all the faithful and people of good will after the historic Supreme Court decision June 24, 2022, that ruled that abortion was not a right defined in the United States Constitution but left the decision to the states.

The Supreme Court's decision to allow states to determine abortion laws fills my heart with a combination of sadness and gratitude. In 2022 - with all of our scientific advancements that prove beyond any doubt that the CHILD inside a mother's womb is human – it troubles me that in the moment of extreme vulnerability for both the woman and the baby that the violence of abortion is even discussed and debated as a good. How did our hearts become so hardened?

I am saddened that some pregnant women feel their only option to a happy future involves ending their baby's life. I am saddened that there are so many people who promote abortion as the only "choice." I am saddened that abortion facilities are primarily located in areas where people of color live and those women - and their babies - are targeted by an industry that profits from death. Most of all, I am saddened

that since the 1973 Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion in our country, the lives of more than 60,000,000 of our most innocent and vulnerable sisters and brothers have been ended in the false understanding of "freedom."



It would be easy to dwell in sadness and despair, particularly considering that abortion continues to be legal in Minnesota and many of our political leaders have shamefully vowed to increase access to ending the lives of the most vulnerable. But I am so grateful for the majority of Americans – especially our young people – who trust the science and know that we need to love and protect the mother and the baby she carries beneath her heart. That is why I am grateful.

For 50 years, the pro-life movement has stood in the breach, speaking up for the babies who have no voice; for the despairing parents, the moms and dads who thought they had no choice. Our dedicated faithful have prayed daily, been assaulted verbally and physically, been threatened and yet have stood fast for life. They have opened their hearts, homes and wallets to care for pregnant and new moms, the dads and their babies, and their extended families. Those who believe in the dignity of all life have opened centers where new parents can get counseling to deal with past trauma, learn parenting and career skills, and have their daily needs met...These generous women and men are the hands, feet and heart of Jesus. They weep with moms and their children when things are difficult – and they can be incredibly difficult - and they celebrate the victories, big and small... That's why I'm grateful.

We don't need more abortion, more death. We need more love, more life! We need to support women and couples who find themselves in crisis pregnancies and don't know where to turn for love and support. As a society, we need to work to fund their basic needs of food, shelter and health care. We need to advocate for quality education for all children and for fair and just wages for parents to support their families. We need to work to make sure that these vulnerable moms are able to deliver their babies and raise them with dignity. We need to give of ourselves - more than our money - to mentor them and journey with them through the wonderful, difficult, joyous messiness of parenthood...We need to be the light in their world. It is only our love and accompaniment that will make abortion unthinkable.

In closing, I implore all women and men of good will to join together in prayer and continue working for the end of legal abortion in Minnesota and in the United States. Our elected officials need to hear that we care about moms, dads, babies and families, and that together, we will support them.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us and for the protection of all life, from the moment of conception to natural death.
