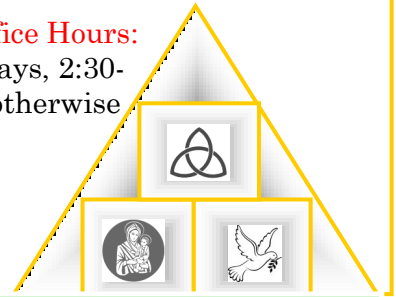

From Father McCabe



Today we celebrate the heart of our Catholic Christian belief, that God is indeed One divine nature, but that God lives in a community of Divine persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit – the Holy Trinity.

We believe this because God the Father sent his Divine Son into the world, born of Mary, to be Jesus Christ, the GodMan, the divine head and leader of the Catholic Church, who pours out the Holy Spirit into us through

his Seven Sacraments beginning with the Sacrament of Baptism.

We are gathered here to worship God because we were baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, when our parents professed the faith for us, so that we might not perish, but might have Eternal life.

As we read in today's Gospel: ***"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might have eternal life... Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God."*** Jn 3:16-18

And what is that name in which our salvation is assured? It is Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and the Son of Mary. Jesus Christ is God and Man, the one Lord who is the giver, sustainer and goal of our life since he leads us to the Father in heaven.

We know that God shows us his unconditional love by creating us, man and woman, in God's divine image and likeness. That is to say, every human being has an intellect and a free will, which gives us the capacity to receive God's divine life in the sacraments in order to follow and share in the benefits of his Ten Commandments of life, love and true freedom as his adopted children.

Even if we should fall from grace, that indelible mark that we have received at baptism and again at our confirmation, continually calls us back to receive his love and mercy in the sacrament of confession and holy communion. Yet, we must have a firm intention on using all that we have, the natural and supernatural gifts God has given to us, to follow Jesus Christ in his Church.

Last night's graduation ceremony was beautiful. It was a joy because the students had received their education from responsible adults, parents and teachers - all of society who have supported our institutions. The students did not have to make up math, invent the English language to write and read it, nor build the school and the instruments and music to enjoy it. Rather, they inherited it and continue to support it by becoming contributing members of society.

These gifts were handed to them and they received and nurtured them in their soul so that they could contribute to the advancement of our society. They are not perfect in this, but they advanced in learning how to use these gifts wisely which benefit all of us, especially when we are grateful to God for them and want to continue to grow these gifts within our God centered community.

So too with the supernatural gifts of our faith. It was Jesus Christ who gives us the seeds of divine faith, hope and love within our souls through Holy Mother Church and her

ministers. We did not deserve to be baptized, but after our baptism we learned to pray our faith, study our faith, be confirmed in our faith, love and serve others from the call of the faith that God gives us. Thus, we merit the growth of God's grace, his divine life within us, because we practice our faith to advance God's kingdom of Eternal Life, Perfect Wisdom and Infinite Love.

Just as each of us objectively needs air to breath, water to drink, food to eat, and a society in which to learn about life and who the giver and goal of life is, namely God, so too we need to receive the objective truth of our Catholic faith and grow with others to advance God's kingdom of life, peace and prosperity.

The "world" does not want us to be saved by Jesus Christ and what his Church offers. The world offers things that we do not need, things that can actually harm our lives and our relationship with God and one another. Do not fall for those deceptions but stay on that straight and narrow path to heaven by following Jesus Christ and the objective truths of the faith, in contrast to the subjective opinions of others.

Speaking of objective truth, I am reminded of an archer who went on a journey to participate in the King's annual target contest. As he journeyed to the city for the match, he kept noticing signs of another archer who appeared to be excellent in his skills. For as he walked along he would see an arrow in the very middle of the bulls eye on a barn, and then on an old stump, and then on a tree, and a very narrow tree. He almost gave up even participating in the match because sometimes he missed the target. But he decided to keep practicing and walked toward the day when the match would begin.

Then he saw through trees in the distance an archer shooting at a group of trees. The arrow lodged into one of them without a target. "That must not be that most excellent archer." But then he saw the archer approach the tree and paint a bulls eye around the arrow. "Ha, a fraud. He is only out to trick others not to participate in the match!"

Jesus knows the true target, the true goal of our life. If we continue to follow him and to go where he sends us to employ our God given gifts, we will always reach our goals; and the ultimate goal of our life is the perfect love of God and our neighbor in heaven through Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, who leads us to God the Father. That is the objective truth Jesus Christ has revealed to us who believe in his sacred name.
