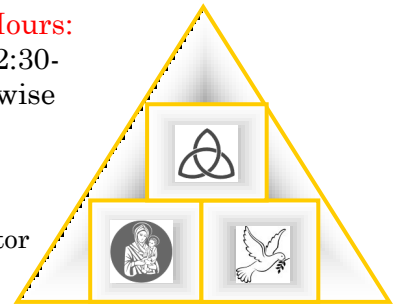

We thank God for the gift of family and life, especially the gift of eternal life that comes to us through our baptism into Jesus Christ and his family the Church.

God gives us life through our mom and dad, and for this reason we thank and honor God with our weekly worship and our daily prayers with the help of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Holy Mother Church. We also honor our parents by thanking them, helping and praying for them, whether they are living or deceased.

Human life is the supreme gift from God because God made us immediately and directly in the divine image and likeness, male and female God made us. Because we have the gift of life through our family, we can receive God's divine life – sanctifying grace – assuredly through the seven sacraments beginning with Baptism into Jesus Christ and his divine family – His Catholic Church.

God gave the Church the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony to unite a baptized man and woman for life long spousal unity and the blessing and raising of children for God's church and his human family. This is revealed in the Gospel of John, Chapter 2, so that the family can become a domestic church – a place of prayer and spiritual growth.

Unfortunately, the family is under attack. When the Bolshevik revolution occurred in Russia to bring a communist party into power November 7, 1917, one of the first things the communist did was to allow for no-fault divorce. A person could divorce their spouse for any reason.

The Communist also prohibited adoption. Orphans would be cared for by the State. Soon the rapid increase of unwed couples, divorced couples and orphans caused incredible social upheaval.

Since the Communist threw out God and his plan of fruitful life with religiously married couples at the center of family life, Russia was the first European country to legalize abortion, October, 1920. Before these things occurred, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children: Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, the oldest at age 10, in Fatima, Portugal, 1917, to pray the Rosary, especially for the conversion of Russia. She first appeared on May 13th and usually the 13th of every month until October 13th, when she promised a miracle to validate the children's vision and her warning to mankind to repent, practice the Catholic faith and to pray daily, especially the Rosary, lest another great war occur (WWII), and Communism spread its errors – of which we clearly see in today's world. On October 13th an estimated 70,000 people gathered at the site of the apparitions. It had rained for days, and Mary appeared to the children and spoke to them, after which the sun appeared and began to "dance" and "rotate" and then plunge toward the earth. Many people ran in panic, others knelt and wept for their sins and many experienced conversion and miracles of healing.

When the sun returned to its original size the ground and clothes of the pilgrims were completely dry. The Virgin Mary revealed herself as Our Lady of the Rosary and asked for all Catholics to practice the faith and pray the rosary daily to convert the world to her divine son, Jesus Christ.

Fatima now has a large shrine dedicated to Our Lady of Fatima where St. John Paul II visited to pray after having survived an attempted assassination May 13, 1981. He attributed his survival to the Virgin Mary's intercession. St. John Paul II gave us another set of mysteries of the Rosary, the Luminous Mysterious, which can be prayed on Thursdays.

The Rosary was given by the Blessed Virgin Mary around 1210 A.D. to St. Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans). These **15 Promises of grace received** by praying the Rosary devoutly was received by another Dominican in the 15th century. Many people can attest to these promises for they have prayed the Rosary devoutly everyday with their family, or alone, and have experienced many blessings.

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces.

[Signal grace: a sign from God. For example, seeing a rose after finishing a novena to St. Therese of Lisieux could be considered a signal grace.]

2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.

3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.

4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.

5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.

6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered and never overwhelmed by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall grow in grace and become worthy of eternal life. [An unprovided death means dying while not in a state of grace (that is, in dying with unconfessed mortal sin on the soul). The Blessed Mother promises that anyone who regularly prays the Rosary, and earnestly tries to live according to God's will, will be spiritually prepared when their time of death comes.]

7. Whoever shall have a true devotion to the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.

8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have, during their life and at their death, the light of God and the plenitude of His graces; at the moment of death, they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.

9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.

10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven. [We have only one life to reach our spiritual potential!]

11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.

12. All those who propagate the holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.

13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.

14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons and daughters, brothers and sisters of my only son Jesus Christ.

15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination. [That is, devotion to the Rosary is a good indication that the devotee is on the path to Heaven.]

During this month of May, the month of Mary and Mother's Day, let us recite the rosary with the knowledge that gives us hope for a high place in heaven, and many blessings here below.

Since our confirmation candidates are planning to be confirmed on Thursday, May 14, 7:00PM at the St. Paul Cathedral I will be providing an opportunity for them and their sponsors to celebrate confession on Wednesday, 7:00 – 8:20PM at the Church of St. Mary, with a Mass to celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima at 8:30PM. I will also provide confessions for them on Thursday, May 14, 3:30-4:45PM at Holy Trinity.

May Crowning at all Masses May 9 & 10: The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three young shepherds beginning on May 13, 1917, near Fatima, Portugal, and asked that all Catholics pray the Rosary daily for the end of war and the conversion of hardened sinners, that peace would reign in our world. In the Glorious Mysteries, the last mystery is the Crowning of Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth. This mystery reflects the truth found in the Book of Revelation: Chapter 12:1,5: *"A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars... She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne.. The serpent, however, spewed a torrent of water out of his mouth after the woman to sweep her away with the current. But the earth helped the woman and opened its mouth and swallowed the flood that the dragon spewed out of its mouth. Then the dragon became angry with the woman and went off to wage war against the rest of her offspring, those who keep God's commandments and bear witness to Jesus."* But do not fear, we follow Christ to victory!

Catechism of the Catholic Church: Paragraph 1337: *The Lord, having loved those who were his own, loved them to the end. Knowing that the hour had come to leave this world and return to the Father, in the course of a meal he washed their feet and gave them the commandment of love. In order to leave them a pledge of this love, in order never to depart from his own and to make them sharers in his Passover, he instituted the Eucharist as the memorial of his death and Resurrection, and commanded his apostles to celebrate it until his return; "thereby he constituted them priests of the New Testament."*

Par. 1414: *As sacrifice, the Eucharist is also offered in reparation for the sins of the living and the dead and to obtain spiritual and temporal benefits from God.*

Par. 1415: *Anyone who desires to receive Christ in Eucharistic communion must be in the state of grace. Anyone aware of having sinned mortally must not receive communion without having received absolution in the sacrament of penance.*

Par. 1416: *Communion with the Body and Blood of Christ increases the communicant's union with the Lord, forgives his venial sins, and preserves him from grave sins. Since receiving this sacrament strengthens the bonds of charity between the communicant and Christ, it also reinforces the unity of the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ.*
