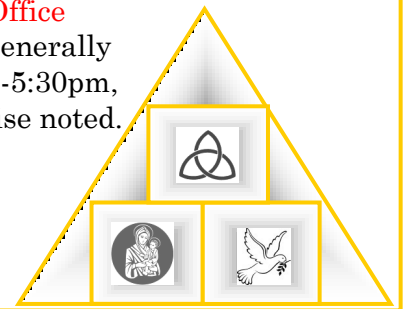

Come to me all you who labor and are burdened.

"We have the spirit, yes we do! We have the spirit, how about you!" Then the opposing team's fans shout, "We have the spirit, yes we do! We have the spirit! how about you." "This goes back and forth increasing in volume until one side says, "We have more! We have more!"

During High School sports there is a certain giving of oneself to the community in order to win the game or attain a goal. Many athletes and band members practice long hours to accomplish such temporary goals.

In a sense, this is what we do at the Holy Mass. We give ourselves to God through the prayers and songs, in the moments of quiet and reflection. And our goal is to win eternity! Praise is a prayer that lifts one's mind and heart to God enthusiastically, for the Holy Spirit within us calls us upward to everlasting life of perfect praise and happiness.

The word "enthusiastic" actually come from the Greek meaning "in God" *en theos*. We need to let the Spirit of God within us pray through us.

Praising God does not always mean singing as loud as we can. Praise can be a quiet turning to God by telling him we love him for having created us, redeemed us, loved us in Christ. After praising God, we can thank him for all the blessings and ask him to open our hearts and minds to receive more of his graces.

When we practice this prayer of praise in the morning and at night, and especially at Mass, we grow closer to God and begin to feel his commitment to us. We can rest assured that he is within us because we are humble and pray in Jesus' name through the power of the Holy Spirit received at our baptism.

When we tap into Jesus Christ who gave himself completely to God the Father, and to all of us as a sacred gift, we can experience him saying to our own soul, "Come to me, all of you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." Cf Mt 11:25-30

The yoke of Jesus is easy and light because he carries it with us out of love for God and others. We are called to do the same for the praise and glory of God. We do this especially at Holy Mass, for through, with and in Jesus Christ we give praise and thanksgiving to God for the blessings of our country and our freedoms, and for those who sacrificed to help us maintain our country and our God given freedoms.

On this special 250th anniversary of our country, I point out where God is mentioned four times in our *Declaration of Independence*. In the first paragraph this document explains why it was written, to explain our right to freedom: "*the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and Nature's God entitle them...*"

In the second paragraph we read: "*We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.*" Of course, "all men" means all men, women and children because homicide of any man, woman or child was seen as an offense against God's 5th commandment: Thou shall not kill. Unfortunately, preborn babies are excluded from this natural right to life and commandment of God due to the flawed legality of abortion in our State of Minnesota.

After listing the grievances against the King of England, the colonial representatives declare: "*We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress, Assemble, appealing to [God] the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions... That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States;...*"

God is mentioned at the very end: "*And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on divine Providence [God], we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.*"

As Catholic Christians, we rejoice that we have such a country established on the above highlighted principles, and we need to participate in enhancing and protecting them with abiding patriotism.

The **Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)** defines "Participation" as "*the voluntary and generous engagement of a person in social interchange. It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person.*" CCC #1913

CCC #1914: *Participation is achieved first of all by taking charge of the areas for which one assumes personal responsibility: by the care taken for the education of his family, by conscientious work, and so forth, man participates in the good of others and of society.*

CCC #1916: *As with any ethical obligation, the participation of all in realizing the common good calls for a continually renewed conversion of the social partners. Fraud and other subterfuges, by which some people evade the constraints of the law and the prescriptions of societal obligations, must be firmly condemned because they are incompatible with the requirements of justice. Much care should be taken to promote institutions that improve the conditions of human life.*

With spirit, we sing in the second verse of the song "America the Beautiful": O beautiful for pilgrim feet, whose stern, impassioned stress, A thoroughfare for freedom beat across the wilderness! America! America! God mend thine every flaw, confirm thy soul in self control, Thy liberty in law."

Missionary: Welcome Fr. Norton Johnson! Thanks for helping us understand the needs of the wider Church, particularly in Sri Lanka. Thank you for presiding at the Masses from July 4th through July 9th.

Fr. Norton Johnson is from Sri Lanka, a beautiful island nation in the Indian Ocean. The number of Catholics in his diocese is about 46,000, spread over 30 parishes, served by 39 diocesan priests and 16 religious order priests. 93 religious brothers and sisters serve in parishes, schools, hospitals, colleges and universities. **Challenges:** +The Diocese of Batticaloa has no means to provide food and accommodation for the new seminarians.

+ OZANAM Centre for handicapped children needs support.

+ Churches destroyed by war/tsunami must be rebuilt/renovated.

+ More re-evangelization programs needed in border villages among multi-religious people.

+ Support needed for Small Christian Communities which are formed through Bible studies and there pastoral care takes place.

Hiring part time Faith Formation Assistant/Safety Environment Coordinator: Must be a practicing Catholic, at least age 21 who has a MN Driver's License. Help Fr. McCabe and volunteers up to 10 hours per week, \$16-\$22/hr. depending on skill set and flexibility which includes helping with Vacation Bible Camp in Summer, NET Ministry retreat and other activities. The Essential 3 Safe Environment program (background check, Code of Conduct and VIRTUS training) will need to be completed. Contact Fr.
