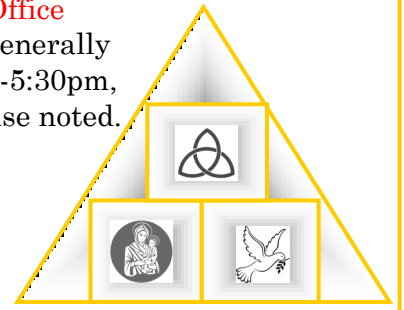

We are in our second week of “Fortnight for Freedom” which is asking God to convert our country to his natural and supernatural laws of life and salvation. So far over 45 people have prayed the Patriotic Rosary which offers up one Hail Mary for each of our 50 states. You can check out the “Calendar/Events” section in our Sunday bulletin to find out when you can join us.

Since Jesus Christ was tried by the government official Pontius Pilate there has been tension between the Church of Jesus Christ and government officials, even Catholic government officials. However, God has always continued his mission of saving grace and truth despite worldly powers.

Fortnight for Freedom is two weeks and ends July 4th, during which we pray and commemorate our country’s 250th anniversary of the signing of the **Declaration of Independence**. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) introduced this program which begins around the church feast days of some great martyrs, including saints John Fisher, Bishop and Martyr, and high ranking official in King Henry the VIII’s court, Thomas More, Martyr.

Both men stood up to the decadence of King Henry VIII (who beheaded two of his wives) even as they sought to reason with him to refrain from taking over the Catholic Church in England. King Henry beheaded the Bishop John Fisher on June 22 and Thomas More on July 6, 1535, but we celebrate their stalwart faith on June 22.

The following is a letter from Thomas More to his daughter Margaret while he was in prison:

Although I know well, Margaret, that because of my past wickedness I deserve to be abandoned by God, I cannot but trust in his merciful goodness. His grace has strengthened me until now and made me content to lose goods, land... rather than to swear against my conscience. God’s grace has given the king a gracious frame of mind toward me, so that as yet he has taken from me nothing but my liberty. In doing this His Majesty has done me such great good with respect to spiritual profit that I trust that among all the great benefits he has heaped so abundantly upon me I count my imprisonment the very greatest. I cannot, therefore, mistrust the grace of God. Either he shall keep the king in that gracious frame of mind to continue to do me no harm, or else, if it be his pleasure that for my other sins I suffer in this case as I shall not deserve, then his grace shall give me the strength to bear it patiently, and perhaps even gladly.

By the merits of his bitter passion joined to mine and far surpassing in merit for me all that I can suffer myself, his bounteous goodness shall release me from the pains of purgatory and shall increase my reward in heaven besides.

I will not mistrust him, Meg, though I shall feel myself weakening and on the verge of being overcome with fear. I shall remember how Saint Peter at a blast of wind began to sink because of his lack of faith, and I shall do as he did: call upon Christ and pray to him for help. And then I trust he shall place his holy hand on me and in the stormy seas hold

me up from drowning.

And if he permits me to play Saint Peter further and to fall to the ground and to swear and forswear, may God our Lord in his tender mercy keep me from this... Still, if this should happen, afterward I trust that in his goodness he will look on me with pity as he did upon Saint Peter, and make me stand up again and confess the truth of my conscience afresh and endure here the shame and harm of my own fault.

And finally, Margaret, I know this well: that without my fault he will not let me be lost. I shall, therefore, with good hope commit myself wholly to him. And if he permits me to perish for my faults, then I shall serve as praise for his justice. But in good faith, Meg, I trust that his tender pity shall keep my poor soul safe and make me commend his mercy.

And, therefore, my own good daughter, do not let your mind be troubled over anything that shall happen to me in this world. Nothing can come but what God wills. And I am very sure that whatever that be, however bad it may seem, it shall indeed be the best.

Clearly, Thomas More trusted that God was in control and that he could only lose his salvation by freely choosing to forsake God, but that God is always willing to give us the grace not to do that. Yet, More is under duress and if he denies Jesus the way Peter did, he hopes to receive the same mercy and opportunity to “*make me stand up again and confess the truth of my conscience afresh and endure here [on this earth] the shame and harm of my own fault.*”

Thomas More emphasizes to his daughter that “*Nothing can come but what God wills*” and we need to understand that God has an active will, which motivates us to do the good; and God has a passive will, by which God allows bad things to occur, only because he can bring a greater good from it.

In other words, if Pontius Pilate or King Henry VIII decided not to murder Christ and Thomas More, respectively, then that is a good. Yet, because they freely chose to facilitate their execution, God was able to bring a greater good out of it by pouring forth grace for the conversion of many others. Of course, all grace poured out is caused ultimately by Christ’s death upon the cross. The consequence of holy people putting their complete trust in God made some other people feel like God had abandoned those martyrs, but actually the God of true love and saving grace was helping all understand that loving God above all things, even family, allows us to love God in others appropriately for the sake of their salvation.

Pope Leo XIV’s Prayer Intention for July 2026:

Let us pray for the respect and protection of human life in all stages, recognizing it as a gift from God.

Peter's Pence Second Collection: Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, helps the poor throughout the world through his charitable giving. This annual collection helps him reach out to those most in need with his special care and prayers. Our first American Pope asks us to be a part of his personal ministry through our prayers and monetary sacrifice this weekend of June 27/28.

Mass of Christian Burial: For Jerry Majerus Monday, June 29, 11:00AM at the Church of St. Mary, Bellechester, with Visitation beginning at 9:30AM. He died on Monday evening after receiving the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Dying on Sunday evening, and the Chaplet of Diving Mercy was prayed with his family. *Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.*

Missionary: We will host a missionary priest through the St. Paul and Minneapolis Archdiocese Mission Cooperation Plan (MCP), by which we get a greater vision of the Church and have an opportunity to help those in need. Fr. Norton Johnson will stay with Dc. Paul Tschann and serve Masses July 4th through July 9.

Fr. Norton Johnson is from Sri Lanka, a beautiful island nation in the Indian Ocean. The number of Catholics in his diocese is about 46,000, spread over 30 parishes, served by 39 diocesan priests and 16 religious order priests. 93 religious brothers and sisters serve in parishes, schools, hospitals, colleges and universities.

One area of great concern is the "Ozanam Center" home for handicapped female children, as well as ten orphanages. Small Christian Communities are formed through which Bible studies and pastoral care takes place. In small parishes, there are about 100 to 150 children attending Religious Formation; in larger parishes, there are more than 500 800 children who attend the Sunday class.

Hiring part time Faith Formation Assistant/Safety Environment Coordinator: Must be a practicing Catholic, at least age 21 who has a MN Driver's License. Help Fr. McCabe and volunteers up to 10 hours per week, \$16-\$22/hr. depending on skill set and flexibility which includes helping with Vacation Bible Camp in Summer, NET Ministry retreat and other activities. The Essential 3 Safe Environment program (background check, Code of Conduct and VIRTUS training) will need to be completed. Contact Fr. McCabe at 651-923-4472 and have references available by July 15.

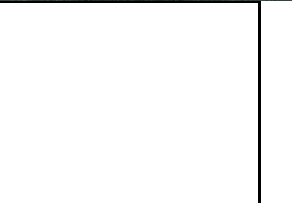
